Daniel E. Ho is the William Benjamin Scott and Luna M. Scott Professor of Law, Professor of Political Science, and Senior Fellow at the Stanford Institute for Economic Policy Research at Stanford University. His scholarship centers on quantitative empirical legal studies, with a substantive focus on administrative law, regulatory policy and antidiscrimination law.

He received his JD from Yale Law School and PhD in political science from Harvard University and clerked for Judge Stephen F. Williams on the U.S. Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Circuit.

Ho served as president for the Society of Empirical Legal Studies (2011-12), co-editor of the Journal of Law, Economics, & Organization (2013-16), and directs the Regulation, Evaluation, and Governance Lab (RegLab) at Stanford, which partners with government agencies to design and evaluate programs, policies, and technologies to modernize governance.
